The 2009 Season

During the period from the beginning of January to the end of October (and the end of our season), ticket sales increased from £6,094.50 in 2008, to £7,323.50 in 2009, an improvement of nearly 20%. Although other heritage railways have also reported increased ticket sales in 2009, ours is a tremendous achievement which is not simply the result of a wider trend but is due to hard work on the part of everyone who has played a part in publicising the railway in this time of recession. Keep up the good work! Shop sales showed a more modest increase. Unfortunately, the recession has made itself felt in significant reductions in income from 'Drive and Engine' events and private hire – clearly fewer people have felt able to afford these more expensive products. Of course, 'Drive an Engine' events can bring other benefits, when participants, to whom we give a year's complimentary membership, choose to continue in membership and even to join us as volunteers. Overall, income is down compared to last year, and the debit side of the account is up (including the money lost to theft), so we will be hoping for good results from the Santa Specials and there will be no room for complacency as we enter 2010.

The 2010 Season

For 2010 we are introducing a new event, especially for enthusiasts, and filling the rather long gap between the established events in May and August. 'Diesel Freight Day' will take place on a *Saturday*. There will be no steam and no passenger trains. Visitors will be charged to enter the site, where there will be diesel action, freight trains, and workshop tours. Photography will be encouraged, and photographers will be required to wear (their own) high-vis jackets.
